Re: Registration of Beta Upsilon Chi


Dear Mr. Tracey:

This letter is to follow up on our telephone conversation earlier today confirming our agreement in regards to the issues raised in your letter of December 5, 2006 to Stephen M. Shewmaker regarding the lawsuit you filed on behalf of Beta Upsilon Chi, also on December 5th.

As we discussed, the Division of Student Affairs will process the paperwork to immediately register Beta Upsilon Chi as a student organization at the University of Georgia. Mr. Webster should be receiving the paperwork from Student Affairs in the next few days. We also agreed that your client will have all the rights and responsibilities of a registered student organization except that they will be exempt from the provisions of the University's Non-Discrimination and Anti-Harassment Policy relating to membership in the organization based upon religion.

As we also discussed, the University will be reviewing its student organization policies in the near future and all of your concerns will be thoroughly considered. Thank you very much for your cooperation in this matter. Please do not hesitate to call me if you have any questions or concerns.
